

Ph.D. Position (3 years, 75% E13 TV-L) at the University of Würzburg (JMU)

The *Motivation and Emotion in Action (MovE) Lab* (PI: Prof. Dr. Andreas Eder) at the Institute of Psychology, University of Würzburg (JMU), invites applications for a 3-year Ph.D. position. The university is located in northern Bavaria, Germany, and offers a vibrant cultural and academic environment.

The position is funded by a research grant from the German Research Foundation (DFG), awarded to Prof. Andreas Eder. The project “**P u n i s h m e n t : F r o m A i n v e s t i g a t i o n t o p s y c h o l o g i c a l m e c h a n i s m s u n d e r l y i n g b e h a v i o r a l c h a n g e s a f t e r p u n i s h m e n t**” investigates the psychological mechanisms underlying behavioral changes after punishment.

The successful candidate will join a research team dedicated to the investigation of motivation, emotion, and aggressive behavior. Responsibilities include the design and implementation of behavioral experiments, data analysis, and the dissemination of findings at international conferences and in peer-reviewed journals. The candidate is expected to complete a doctoral thesis on a topic related to motivation and/or emotion within the funding period. Teaching is optional and not required.

Requirements: Applicants must hold a **M a s t e r ’ s d e g r e e (o r e q u i v a l e n t)** in neuroscience, or a related field. They should have a high affinity with, and solid skills for, conducting and analyzing behavioral studies involving human participants. Experience with laboratory research is desirable. Proficiency in English (spoken and written) is necessary. Knowledge of German is an asset but not a prerequisite.

Benefits: The successful candidate will join a vibrant, international research group comprising researchers at various career stages. She or he will additionally benefit from a rich interdisciplinary research environment at the Faculty of Human Sciences with an affiliated graduate school. The PhD position is financed for 3 years and payment is according to 75% E 13 TV-L (see [online calculator](#)).
